There was great fear of a flood yesterday when in the morning the river registered 15 feet above low water mark and it was still rising at the rate of nearly a foot an hour.

When on Thursday the river began its rise, the threatened cold wave caused the hope that that would stop all chance of a flood.

The greater amount of water comes from the Monongahela, and at Brownsville the river registered over 30 feet last evening.

The ice is breaking up in the little streams tributary and a great deal of that passed down stream yesterday, though it was not heavy enough to do any damage.

At this point the Monongahela continued its rise all night, though not so rapidly as during the day.

According to the Signal Service indications it will be clear and to-day, and the thermometer will probably go down to 25°.

The rise has at least frightened the people along the Sewickley Valley and all are preparing for a bigger river.
