

PATERNITY IN DOUBT. A Pretty Little Girl Who Was Adopted When Two Weeks Old IS NOW WONDERING WHO SHE IS.

ORPHAN COURT DECIDES THAT SHE IS NOT Mrs. Kennedy's Child.

YESTERDAY IN THE COUNTY COURTS

An odd case was concluded yesterday in the Orphan's Court. The matter of its ending leaves a cloud of mystery surrounding the origin of a beautiful little girl of 10 years.

A widow, aged 34, Mrs. Flora Kennedy, had, about a year ago, adopted a child, and the Safe Deposit Company was appointed administrator of her estate, and a small amount of money was realized from the sale of her jewelry, most of which was diamond rings.

It was understood that there were two children to divide the money between, but before the distribution was made the Safe Deposit Company received an intimation that there was a third child. Their informant advised that the child had been taken from the orphan's care and given to Mrs. Kennedy, who had been told that the child was the daughter of the orphan's father.

There was no evidence to back up these statements, and the case was dismissed. The court decided the case against the child, the testimony of all being one and the same, and the child's mother was in charge of her son and daughter.

SENTENCES AND DESERTIONS. Occupied a Great Deal of Time in Criminal Court.

Judge Irving handed down an opinion yesterday in the case of William Hamilton against the West Firm Railroad, wherein the plaintiff was ordered to pay \$10,000 for personal injuries. The verdict was rendered in this county in an action for personal injury.
