The first section provides, therefore, that the expenses of the care of the indigent insane of the several poor districts of the Commonwealth, whether cities or counties, shall be borne equally by the State and poor district, provided, that the maximum charge to the State where such insame are not confined in State hospitals, shall not exceed \$2 per week for each person treated and cared for. nt thereto.

Reimbursing the Cities.

The second section provides for the appro-priation of a sum sufficient to reimburse the cities constituting poor districts (not included in the act of 1883) for payment of the expenses of indigent insame incurred in hospitals of city districts since 1883, at the sum per week allowed in the first section of this act, to be paid lowed in the first section of this act, to be paid by the Commonwealth to the proper depart-ment of the several cities. Provided that the chief of department of such institution shall make a report, under oath, to the Auditor Gen-eral of the actual number of indigent insame persons received in hespital from June 13, 1883, to January 1, 1891, with details showing the actual number was treated.

1883, to January I, 1891, with details showing time each person was treated. The third section provides that hereafter it shall be the duty of the chief officer in each city paor district to report to the Auditor General on or before June 1 of each year the number of indigent insane in their districts, with the names, age and other details of each per-

son. The fourth or final section provides that neg-lect or refusal to perform the duties required of the city poor district officials by this act, w d forfeit o that city the whole amount al-used under its provisions.
