During the day the spike, which was six inches long, was suspended by red, white and blue ribbons in the window of the toll-house, and was an object of much interest to those who dropped their pennies in front of the toll-taker. Several of the farms offered last summer were presented again, but at marked-down prices. One is reduced from \$800 an acre to \$400, another from \$350 to \$135, and still another has dropped \$150 an acre from the July quotation.

The ordinance requires that the Department of Awards shall visit each of the sites offered, and within five days make a report of its selection to Councils. As 28 farms are offered the gentlemen will have to examine nearly six narms a day. The Board is therefore at a loss to know whether to inspect the land from car windows, with field glusses, or to have a balloon ascension and take a bird's-eye view.
