### The Southside Market House About Destroyed by Fire Last Night.

A LANDMARK NEARLY WIPED OUT.

For Once There Was Enough Water for the Engines, but It Was

NOT POSSIBLE TO SAVE THE BUILDING

The city is \$25,000 poorer than it was yes terday. Last night at 10 o'clock the Southside Market House was nearly destroyed by fire. The flames were discovered by Alma Hamm, a young lady, who notified Officer Smith, and an alarm was turned in from station 134. The fire started in a rear room on the second floor, wherea natural gas stove is located, but the exact cause is inknown. The are spread through the building very rapidly, and when the engines reached

ing very rapidly, and when the engines reached the scene the entire upper part was in flames. Assistant Chief Stowart immediately turned in a serood alarm, calling another district to the rescue. The fire burst through the roof, and the scene was a very pretty one, showers of aparks being sent in all directions. The firemen made a bold battle with the flames, and for once it can be said that there was to scarcity of water, and no trouble was land to throw streams clear over the building. The fire was a very ferre one, and had to be fought from the outside, as there was too much aught from the outside, as there was too much anger of falling walls and ceilings to venture to the building. It took fully an hour to get be flames under control, and not better the entire inside of the unper int of the building was completely atted. The lower part, which was sed for market purposes, was mostly damed by water.
