

THE HAYMARKET SITE

If Presented, Would Insure Allegheny a Fine Public Building

AT THE GOVERNMENT'S HANDS.

The Problem Cannot Be Solved With the Bids at Present In.

SITES SWALLOW UP TOO MUCH MONEY

FROM A STAFF CORRESPONDENT: WASHINGTON, March 23.—"I sincerely hope that the good people of Allegheny will themselves solve the problem of a site for the new Postoffice," said an official of the Treasury Department today who plays an important part in the selection of sites and the construction of Government buildings. "All of the bids lately submitted are in price much beyond the limits of the amount appropriated for the purchase of a site. The Treasury Department is powerless to move in the matter, without proceeding to select and condemn, as may be done under the law, which would be a tedious proceeding, and one which always arouses antagonism from some quarter. I have visited the beautiful city of Allegheny more than once on business, and am perfectly familiar with its features, and I am particularly glad that the place above all others for the Government building is in the public square, where now stands the City Hall, the market house and the magnificent Carnegie Library.

A Fine Architectural Chance. "Few cities have such an opportunity as Allegheny presents itself for massing impressive architectural piles. The Carnegie Library would be a fine example of the public square, where now stands the City Hall, the market house and the magnificent Carnegie Library.

One of the chief obstacles in the way of giving to the city of Allegheny a fine public building is the cost of the site. The moment this Government asks to buy, prices are run up for every available site, and there is often collision between the holders of such properties and the Government. It is not that the Government will not pay a fair price for a site, but that the price is so high that it is not possible to purchase a site which is available at a price not so high as the value of the site.

The DISPATCH correspondent is informed that the city and officials have had the Treasury authorities to hope that the haymarket site may be secured.
