"As I understand the recent Supreme Court decision," said the Controller, "the city has no right to pass any ordinances relating to opening or improving streets in any way, and I will continue to prevent their being advertised until the Legislature takes some definite action on the street bills now before it. We must respect the court." Fear for the Park Bills.

City officials, as a rule, are confident of the passage of curative legislation. The prospects of the public park bills, however, are not looked upon as being so bright. Coun-cilman Ferguson was speaking of the merits of the bill in the Mayor's office yesterday
