The hearing was interesting and at times lively, and the Judge talked very plainly to the men before him. The men named in the application for the injunction were Chris Goodwin, John Emery, Samuel Hoffman, John Good, P. M. Mahon, O. D. Stacy, Grant Cochran, George Scott, John Trainer, T. Hays, W. Steinway, D. McLaugh-

Judge Ewing delivered another lecture for the benefit of "Squire Glunt and the officers in the vicinity of the works. He said that a man to following his peaceful vocation, when, t following his peaceful vocation, when arassed and assaulted by men on his way to or om his work, had a right to carry a weapon and to shoot down the men who attacked him in order to protect himself. The 'Squire, he said, had no right to harnss these people who were trying to make an honest living. The injunction against 'Squire Glunt and the strikers was then granted. When the men were leaving the court room, Judge Eveng informed them that they needn't think that they were out of the power of the Court when they left the court room. He intended to have them keep the injunction and warned them no to conspire and send other men to do their bidding in molesting the workmen. He said they had hanged men in this county for murder who had been a mile away when the deed was committed.
