GRADED BY UNIFORMS.

Warden Wright Endeavoring to Do Away With Prison Stripes.

A grade system is being introduced at the Western Peniteutiary in reference to a style of uniforms for the convicts. Three different uniforms will be worn. The third grade, or the lowest will be a suit with very large stripes. The second will have small stripes and in the first a plain gray uniform somewhat similar to those worn by letter carriers will be adopted. The prisoners will be classified according to their merits and good

standing. A prisoner who serves for six months with a good record will be placed in the second class, and if he continues the record for a year longer he will be classed in

the first grade. Warden Wright said the system was in Reformatory and vogue at the Huntingdon Reformatory and that it inspired the prisoners there to main-tain a good behavior. The same principle, he said, would hold good in the penitentiary and serve as an encouragement to the men to and serve as an encouragement to the men to rise to the highest grade. Many of the men, he said, abhorred the large stripes and to win a neat, plain uniform would do anything in their power and, would submit willingly to the necessary discipline.
