DOUBLING UP ON LOWRIE STREET.

Switches New Being Laid All Along That Thoroughfare.

YESTERDAY IN THE COUNTY COURTS

A bill in equity was filed yesterday by F. J. Fleck, E. Wahleler, J. Winkelman, George Salatha, J. C. Davidson, Lawrence Walter, Sr., M. Rickel and Mary Gas against the Federal Street and Pleasant Valley Passenger Railway Company, operating the Troy Hill Passenger Railway. The plaintiffs are property owners on Lowrie street, Allegheny. The Troy Hill company, by ordinance on September 11, 1890, was granted right of way for a single track on Lowrie street from Gardner street to Niggle street. The company, it is alleged. now has workmen at intervals of about tw squares, who are moving the track from the middle of the atreet to within four test of

the curb.

They are also nutting in long switches, which occupy almost the whole street, it be-ing only 24 test wide. The ordinance granting them a right of way, it was alleged, had no provision for switches. The plaintiffs believe that it is the inten-

tion of the company to make its return along Lowrie street, instead of taking the circuitous route provided in the ordinance. They will eventually, it is claimed, con-tinue the switches until they form a uniform double track over Lowrie street, which is in violation of the ordinance.

The Court is asked to grant an injunction The Court is asked to grant an injunction restraining the defendants from laying the switcher, and compel them to put down the tracks in accordance with the ordinance.
