REDIN WALKS AGAIN.

Doctors Jubilant over a Successful Case of Bone Grafting.

THEY USED THE HIND LEG OF A DOG

His Limb Has Knitted Perfectly and His Ankle Works Freely.

KEPT SEVENTEEN WEEKS IN PLASTER

The authorities of Mercy Hospital are happy over a successful bone grafting experiment. The happiest one, though, is Samuel Redin, the 9-year-old boy on whom the operation was made over four months ago. The boy's leg was grafted with the bone from the hind leg of a dog. His leg is now declared perfect, but he still wears a leather brace to keep the limb straight. In a eek he will be as strong as ever The accident which caused the operation coursed just as the Bedin family was leaving Europe. The limb was dressed there but in the ocean voyage it was neglected. Dr. Buchanan was called in six weeks after the arrival here and di-covered the bone was dead. He wanted to amputate the member. The father objected and hence the experiment was made.

The operation was performed by Drs. Buchanan, Hardtmeyer, Robison, McManus, Mever and Lesile. The boy's leg has been kept it plaster paris. For 17 weeks. Last Friday morning Dr. Buchanan ordered the cast removed. The boy was then told to stand on the leg. He at once walked several steps. He could also work his ankle joint fairly. He was sent back to bed, but his nurse had only left the room when he crossed the floor and engaged in a quarrel with another lad, a patient in the same ward, about a lead pencil.

The leg was almost entirely healed with the exception of a small portion, which will be all right in the course of a week. The leather brace arrived and was placed on the leg Saturday morning. When it was placed on him, Redin took a walk around the ward. The physicians pronounce the case a complete success.
