LIKE A TINDER BOX

Four Departments of Jones & Laughha's Mill Quickly Burned.

THE LOSS WILL REACH \$50,000.

Much Valuable Work, Partially Done, Destroyed or Ruined.

WORK OF REBUILDING TO BEGIN AT ONCE

For the third time within ten days Jones & Laughlin's Iron Works were visited by fire, d this time the bridge works or structural department, and the straightening, shear and roll houses were entirely consumed, at a loss of \$50,000, the amount of insurance being \$45,000. Last week there were two small fives, but little damage was done. The company is not going to wait long until it will be ready to start again, as men were put to work yesterday, almost before the ruins were old, removing the debris preparatory to the erection of a new iron structure. The firm has numerous large orders on hand which must be filled.

The four departments which were burned vere under a one-story trame roof, 280x200 fect. The fire originated in the straightenshop, which is located at the foot of South Twenty-sixth street, facing the Mobuth Twenty-sixth street, facing the Mo-oughlels river. A spark from a steam saw sed in cutting iron flow into a pile of waste and refuse, and in a moment the flames aped up the sides of the building to the of. A strong wind was blowing, and al-ost immediately the entire building was veeloped in flames. The light, inflammable none which composed it burned like a fur-ace for an hour. An alarm was sent in from box 157, and on

the arrival of Chief Stewart he sent in a call for two additional districts. The fire was so thyid, however, that the whole plant was a sheet of fiame before the first engine ar-rived. The fire department did effective work and kept it conlined to the one buildwork and kept it confined to the one build-ing, though the finness were intense enough to boil the tar out of a root 50 feet away. The direction of the wind, too, was favorable, and blew across the river away from the mills. In the roll house about 80 rolls were similarly affected and will have to be redressed.
