AN OLD CASE OPENED.

Thomas O'Brien Claims He Was Arrested Through Spite Work - Charges Made Against Clerk Leon Long-The Latter

Denies the Entire Story. Thomas O'Brien is in jail for a crime of which he was convicted four years ago, He TO BE RE-ELECTED FOR NEXT YEAR. has remained in the city nearly all that time unmolested. O'Brien was convicted of running a disorderly house and was out on \$500 bail. He jumped his bond and was out of the city for five months. He then returned and nothing was done until Wednesday. O'Brien was seen in his cell yesterday and had the following to say in regard to

his arrest: "I have been told and am satisfied that Lonny Long, of the Clerk of Court's office, and Charley Stevens, the saloonkeeper, are back of this. I have been back in Pitts burg four years and have not been in the liquor business since that time, and have tried to live correctly. A few weeks ago Charley Stevens, the Market street saloonkeeper, made a brutal attack on my father, who is 60 years old. He hit him on the head with a revolver, and otherwise abused him in such a manner that he is not over it yet. My father made an information against him, charging him with assault and battery. He was importuned to withdraw the suit but refused. Now Lonny Long and Steven are great friends, and I have it straight that Long said he would fix me if the case was not settled. He was in the Clerk of Courts office at the time, and had the record. think he has gone to Judge Ewing and told him about me, and that caused my arrest.

I will say right here that I will rot in jail before I will permit my father to withdraw Clerk Long declares that O'Brien's story is false. "I was out of town for two weeks up to last Saturday," he said, "and since my return have been playing at the Bijou every night and spend very little time at the Court House. I don't even know O'Brien. I am a friend of Stevens just as I am of a hundred other people. I don't see why my name should be connected with the

thing at all, as I was not in a position to do it. The matter came from the other court." Charles Stevens was also asked what he had to say regarding the matter and he promptly denied it. "It is true I had trouble with O'Brien's father. He attacked me on the street with a handy-billy and knocked me down. He then entered an in-
