

LATE NEWS IN BRIEF.

Secretary Noble is at his desk again. A rich gold vein is said to have been discovered in Hastings county, Ont. The drought has been renewed in India and crops are growing worse again. General Forester has experienced severe earthquake shocks, but without damage. General Joseph Wheeler, an Alabama Congressman, has joined the Farmers' Alliance. Norway can take no steps toward exhibiting at the World's Fair until its Parliament meets. The new Chilean cruiser, Presidente Pinto, has left Portsmouth, England, for an unknown destination. The American and British Bering Sea Commissioners have completed their task and are on their way home. Rumor that A. Seneca, the bookie superintendent of the Canadian Government Printing Bureau, has resigned. The postoffice authorities are now selling Canadian papers containing lottery advertisements when they cross the line. General Miles condemns the scheme to consolidate all State troops and place them under the control of the Secretary of War. The Southern Pacific or Morgan line of steamers, plying between New York and Galveston, has dropped Galveston as its port and substituted New Orleans. Reported that Spain has notified the British Government that the treaty giving Canadian products the benefit of the "most favored nation" clause will be abrogated. Although Senator Gordon, as well as other law makers, has been formally asked by the Georgia Farmers' Alliance how he stands on the Ocala platform, he is still non-committal. Four white adventurers who were returning from the Canadian Northwest loaded with gold, were captured from a canoe and drowned. That is the story brought to Winnipeg by Indians. The latest Chinese immigration fraud in San Francisco is the issuance by unknown parties of bogus notary certificates of prior residence, which have been forwarded to China to common immigrants. A negro assistant to an aeronaut became entangled in the ropes of a balloon just before it was ready to go up. The balloon then broke loose, and shot upward with the negro to the height of 1,000 feet, leaving its guiding hand on the ground, and then fell a mile away. The terrified captive escaped unhurt. Robert Sims, indicted for illicit distilling, was arrested Wednesday by United States Marshal W. C. Scribbling, and a posse 20 miles from Bladen Springs, Choctaw county, Ala. Friday night his friends came to his rescue and a fight took place, in the midst of which Sims escaped. In the melee Dr. A. R. Pugh, of the posse, and a son of Sims were killed, and a brother of Sims was fatally wounded.

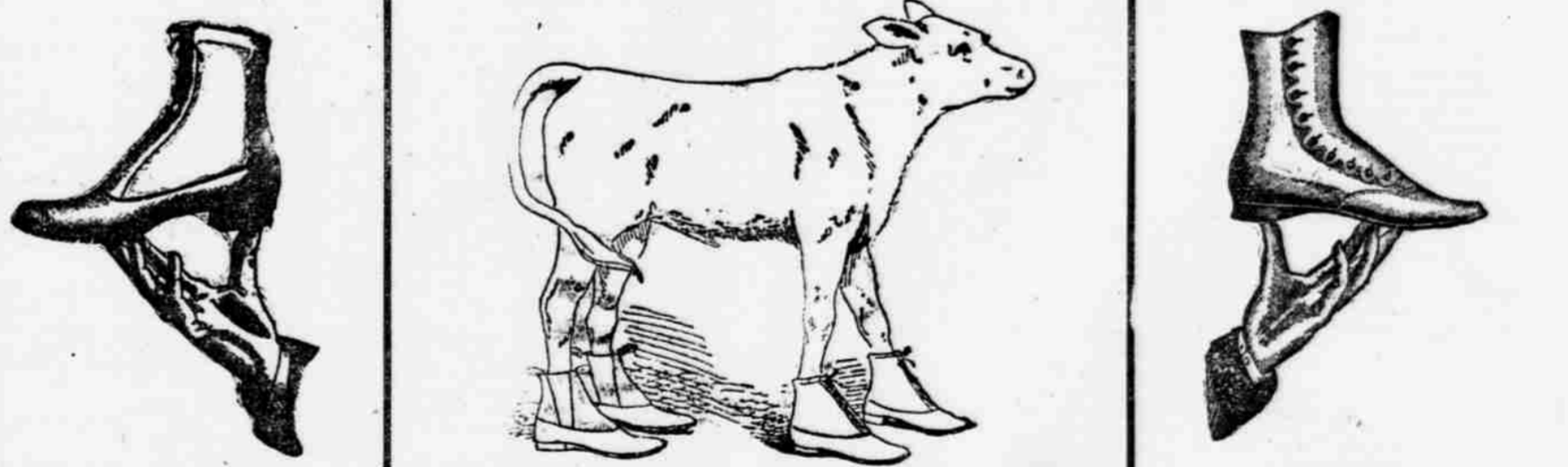
