

**MONEY LOST IN GAS.**  
Secretary Shields, of the Allegheny Heating Company, Thinks

**SYMPATHY SHOULD BE DIVIDED.**  
Owners of Stocks Who Have Been Fined by the Shortage of Fuel.

**CONSUMERS ALONE BENEFITED 80 FAR**

Thomas L. Shields, Secretary of the Allegheny Heating Company, is strongly of the opinion that at least some holders of natural gas stocks deserve at present condoleance rather than criticism. Mr. Shields says they did more to develop these cities of late years than any other similar number of people of equal means and that from present outlook, all they are likely to have for it as the end of another year or two will be a good many thousands of tons of wrought iron pipe under ground.

Mr. Shields says that at present a great many holders of natural gas shares are people of small means, and many beside Messrs. Schermer and Chambers have suffered, and some of these people of lesser means will suffer severe on account of their investments in that stock which has attracted attention. Mr. Shields holds that some credit should be given also to the large capitalists who had the courage to embark in the business, as while they married their own fortunes they made those of others and contributed at the same time to the general welfare.

**THE DEPRECIATION IN STOCKS.**  
Take the case, for instance, of Charters stock. There have been \$30 a share paid in stock and to-day it would be scarcely hypothecated on any basis, and the dividends it has paid amount to but little. Mr. Shields contends that the advance in prices the proposition that, aside from stock gamblers, they are the real beneficiaries of the business. The developers have lost, and the owning party, the consumer getting something for his money.

**PREPARING TO GET MORE GAS.**  
The Philadelphia Company has also bought some half dozen wells in the Coraopolis field, and a line of pipe is now being laid to connect with the Charters line at the latter's works. The Philadelphia Company will be supplied from this line, and this, Mr. Shields states, would increase the expenditures of the company. However, he said, there was a prospect that the winter's revenue would be spent in these extensions.

At the meeting of the Board of Directors on Saturday, the 27th inst., the Directors on Sunday, it was decided that the advance made by the Philadelphia Company would affect the customers of the Allegheny Heating Company to the same extent. So after September 1st, the rate on the Charters gas will be 20 cents per 1,000 feet for the same amount.

If artificial fuel gas does not take the place of natural there will still be considerable salvage for the companies, though the market will be glutted with wrought iron pipe for some time. It does not appear to develop very rapidly, but it is being laid down some where the other day, the covering which was mainly cinders and tanking was not laid in the least.
