## CITY FUNDS FAILING.

A Big Shortage in Appropriations Leaving the Pittsburg and Lake Eric depot When the Year Closes.

ESTIMATES WERE TOO GENEROUS. Centroller Morrow's Prediction Borne Out

### by Figures IN HIS REPORT FOR SIX MONTHS BACK

The close of this fiscal year will find the city without enough money to operate the various branches of its government. When the last appropriation ordinance was under consideration Controller Morrow sent a communication to Councils. It showed where the Finance Committee had estimated receipts too high and expenditures too low. He predicted a large deficit before the year was out. Now he has cold columns of figures to prove the correctness of

The Controller has completed his report of the receipts and expenditures of the aunicipal government for the six mouths ending August 31. In submitting the report for publication the Controller said he had not given the details sufficient thought to make a statement as to what position the city's finances are in, according to this re-port. He probably will be able to do so on return next Priday from Atlantic City. Among the receipts are three items on which the money has all been received and to more revenues from those sources will to more revenues from those sources will be derived this year. They are vehicle license \$42,500 92; the city's sinare of liquor iconse fees, \$73,008, and State warrant for public school purposes, \$77,243 31. In its estimate of receipts for the year the Finance committee, when it prepared the appropriation ordinance last February, over-estimated each of these. It's calculation on vehicle leense was \$45,000, liquor licenses \$80,000 and sinte warrants \$77,703.
