Mr. Cappa, Waiter Rogers, the noted cornetist, and other leading members of the organiza-tion, are quartered at the Anderson. The tion, are quartered at the Anderson. The full band is composed of 65 pieces, 42 of the best of whom are here. Their engagement at the Exposition will last until the close, October 17. During this time they will give concerts every day from 2 to 3 o'clock, from 4 to 5, from 7 to 8 and from 9 to 10 r. m. except on Saturdays, when they play until 18:20. The regular programmes will include miscellaneous selections both popular and classical, but on Friday evenings nothing but classic music will be rendered. It is proposed also to render a number of "request programmes" before the close. Complete programmes for the entire series of concerts have been arranged, and no two are alike.
