CRIMINAL COURT OPENS NEXT WEEK

A bill in equity was filed yesterday by James Blick, Henry Loutitt, William Jenkins and William Duncan, mine inspectors, against J. D. Sauters, the mine owner and operator. The plaintiffs state that they are the inspectors for the First, Second, Fifth and Seventh districts of the bituminous coal region of Pennsylvania. Sauters owns and operates a coal mine in North Fayette township, which is in Inspector James Blick's district. It asserted that on August

Blick made an official examination Sauter's mine, and found the condition of it such that the delay necessary to proceed in the ordinary method provided by law would, in his judgment, jeopardize the lives and limbs of the emes working in the mine. Buck notified the other inspectors, and on August 28 they all exmained it and agreed that there was great danger. The mine, it was stated, is erforated with seven oil and gas wells, and large number are in process drilled into and through the mise and others are projected. Two of the wells drilled through the mine show sediment and water passing from the drill holes into the mine. Oil wells in the egion of this mine produce large volumes gas, and in going through the mine there is great and immediate danger from behind the casing of the wells or from a break in it the easing of the wells or from a break in it directly into the mine or through crevices in the strata, thereby filling the mine with gas. One of the wells is now producing gas in dangerous quantities and the other six are approaching the gas producing strata. There 169 persons employed daily in this mine. In consequence of this condition of affairs the Court is asked to make an order compelling J. D. Sauters to suspend all work in and about the said ming. The bill was filed by Attorney R. D. Jones.
