Section I. Be it enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the borough of Glenfield, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of same. They, any and all person or persons, com-

They, any and all person or persons, companies, corporations or associations now owning or maintaining within the limits of the borough of Glenfield, gates hung or arranged to open or swing out and toward the boardwalk, pavement or street, shall, within ten days from date of notice from the Council of the borough of Glenfield, remove such gate or obstruction, and if such gate or gates be located, hung and arranged have not been removed within the time as stated in such notice, then the same can and shall be removed by the proper authorities of the borough of Glenfield at the proper cost and expense to party or parties, companies, cor-

expense to party or parties, companies, cor porations or associations owning and main

porations or associations owning and maintaining such gate or gates.
