

SLOYD IS POPULAR.

Great Rush of Pupils to Get Into the New Industrial School. THE OBJECTS TO BE ATTAINED. Occupation of the Fathers of the Children Under Instruction. AN IMPROVED EXAMINATION SYSTEM

The Sloyd industrial school at the Forbes school is to be a very popular department if the rush of pupils is an indication. The classes are now all formed, eight from the Forbes school and two each from the normal and commercial departments of the High School.

All the boys of the Forbes school wanted to be in the drawing class, which was the means employed for selection, it happened that in two classes out of three, the boys were entitled to enter. The course this could not be allowed when so many were anxious to be enrolled, so those in authority, after consultation with the fathers of the children, decided the older ones should be the lucky ones.

The Object of the School. Superintendent Luckey, in speaking about the Sloyd school yesterday, said: "It is a mistaken idea for our people to think that it is a regular school and will turn out skillful mechanics. Its object is to educate the youthful hands to do almost anything. The colleges turn out scholars, but their hands are useless. They cannot make a living with them. Rowing is about the only thing they are taught to do."

A New System of Examinations. Prof. J. M. Logan, of the Peabody school, is the originator of a valuable idea, which he would like to see carried out in the schools, and the idea is that the teachers of the High School classes in the ward schools should examine the pupils always on the lookout for examination papers from other schools and all sources possible that they can give a better idea of the progress of the pupils.

Teachers Shifting About. An unusual number of changes are occurring among the teachers since the opening of school. Miss MacWhinney, of the Moorhead school, has accepted a position in the Street, and Miss Butler, of the Street, goes to the Lincoln. Friday evening Miss Lyle, of the Mt. Washington school, was elected to a position in the Moorhead, which makes four vacancies now to be filled in the Mt. Washington school.

Miss Helena Forster, whose removal from the assistant principalship of the Moorhead school, two years ago, will be remembered, went a year ago to Fairport and has an excellent position there. In July her sister Amanda, of the Lincoln school, resigned to join her sister in the West. Miss Funderberg, of the Osceola school, just returned last Wednesday from Atlantic City. Her vacation was largely spent in the improvement derived at Atlantic City to her mother's health.
