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STATING TIME AND INTEREST. The Ordinance for a Vote on Increasing the City Indebtedness to Be Amended—Morrow's Plan.

Controlling Morrow's amendment to the ordinance for a vote on increasing city debt will be adopted.

Chairman Magee and Committee member Keating both opposed the plan at first.

That the question of increasing the bonded indebtedness of the city of Pittsburgh to an amount not exceeding \$2,000,000 by the issue of bonds bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 5 per cent per annum and maturing in not exceeding 10 years from the date of their issue.
