It was reported yesterday that the bondsmen of ex-Warden Berlin, of the county jail, would be called upon to foot up the bills incurred on account of the escape of Fred Fitzsimmons, Investigation proved that nothing definite in this matter, but that there had been some talk about it. Several members of the Prison board have thought of the question and decided to secure some legal opinion on it. The expenses necessitated by the efforts to capture Fitzsimmons were rather heavy. An immense amount of advertising, with circulars and photographs to the number of 30,000 has cost considerable money. Should the fugitive be captured the amount will be

When Berlin tendered his resignation the Prison Board, by unanimous resolution, exonersted him from all blame in the matter. They had testimony from both sides of the case and made their decision on t. There is little probability of their findng being reversed.

PRISON BOARD MEETS THIS MORMING. A special meeting of the Prison Board when, if the judges will attend, Keeper Price will be given an opportunity to explain away the charges against him. Several members of the board are desirous of having it settled and done with. The reason they give is that if the charges are true Warden McAleese should not be hampered with incompetent or untrust-worthy men for a moment longer than is cessary, and he should be given permisfor promptly to make such changes among subordinates as he may deem necessary to the high class of discipline he desires to

It is also argued that the responsibility for making these changes should properly be assumed by the board, and not by the sarden, who, however, will not hesitate in all duty if the board should fail to take ction in that direction.
