Homestead People Won't Pay the Advance in the Price of Gas.

MASS MEETING HELD LAST NIGHT.

Unless the Old Tariff is Restored They Will Go Back to Coal.

ACTION OF THE COMPANY CONDEMNED

Citizens of Homestead are very emphatically opposed to having their gas rates raised. So strong is the feeling that the matter has become a public issue.

NEW STEPS OF SCIENCE.

INTERESTING MEETING OF THE NATIONAL ACADEMY.

A New Free Pendulum That Will Measure Time Perfectly—A Beautiful Exhibit of North American Birds—Simple Way of Determining the Lense Theory.

New York, Nov. 11.—[Special.]—The National Academy of Science met this morning in the Columbia College chapel.

President Marsh presided. Among the members present were: George F. Barker, of Philadelphia; Henry P. Bowditch, of Salem, Mass.; W. K. Brooks, of Baltimore; George J. Brush, of New Haven; Theodore N. Gill, of Washington; James Hall, Albany; Clarence King, of New York City; Samuel P. Langley, of Washington; Thomas C. Mendenhall, of Washington; Albert A. Michelson, of Worcester; John W. Powell, of Washington; and Charles H. Young, of Princeton.

Prof. Hastings, of Yale University, read a paper on "Certain New Methods and Results in Optics." He gave an interesting account of very simple ways of determining the theory of lenses.

By means of the new apparatus he has obtained equal in accuracy to those found by the old methods of Katen and Pierce in one-tenth of the time.

The next paper was read by Prof. Mendenhall, Superintendent of the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey. It was a description of the new pendulum apparatus for measuring the force of gravity at different places on the earth's surface.
