A MINISTER IN HOC.

Joseph Sheehey Locked Up Charged With Being Disorderly.

CLAIMS TO BE AN ARMY CHAPLAIN

Government Officials Must Answer for the Alleged Outrage.

APPEARANCE OF THE MYSTERIOUS MAN

A gentleman with a ministerial air, giving the name of Rev. Joseph Sheehey, was arrested at Mulvihill's saloon, on Eleventh street, at 7 o'clock last night, for ordering drinks and refusing to pay for them. He was locked up in the Central station, charged with disorderly conduct. Officer Mike Carr made the arrest.

Rev. Mr. Sheehey is probably 55 years old. His hair is as white as snow. It was neatly and carefully brushed back from his broad forchend. He wears long gray whiskers. His face is cleanly shaven in a nicely curved line running from one car to the other and along his thick lower lip. He wenrs a Reman collar. His black broadcloth ceat buttons to the neck. His clothes are good and they are tidy and spotless. He carried his silk-lined overcont carclessly over his left arm and he looked an ideal parson and a polished gentleman.

When Sheehev entered Mulvihill's saloor he stood for fully ten minutes looking about the place. He then approached the bar and called for whisky. He was given a bottle of cheap liquor. He tasted it and called for a better quality. He was then given another grade of goods. He drank it with apparent relish, but gave no signs of settling. Finally the bar keeper asked for the 15 cents. "Just a moment" the custemer replied. "I am a United States detective and I have my eye on a couple of parties. Wait until I get a couple of police to help me." He then attemped to leave the place, but was interrupted by the officer who arrested him.

At the Central station the alleged minister became furious. He said he was a chaplain in the English army, and had been for many years stationed in India. He denonneed his arrest as an outrage against the English Government. He said his regard for President Harrison would prevent his baving the chief executive of the nation arrested, but he promised to make things decidedly warm for some of the officials under the President. He served notice on the other prisoners that they should not pay a cent of money for fines or forfeit, and promised them that he would appear in court in the morning and secure their release without price. Upon the prison authorities he served notice that if he suffered a cold or any injury to his health from his imprison ment he would in the morning promptly enter suit for damages. He demanded a softer bed than the plank supplied for pris-oners, and when refused the bed he asked in the politest terms for a blanket with which to cover himself.

In his cell last night the alleged minister denied having said he was a detective, and said that he had asked that the whisky be given him as he knew he had no money with which to pay for it. He said he had come to Pittsburg from St. Louis ten days ago and that he had run out of money. He had called yesterday and had secured an audience with Bishop Phelan, but had not asked for and had not received any money

asked for and had not received any money from the Bishop.

Sheehey is certainly a mysterious man. His dress and his general appearance are those of a minister, refined and educated. He was intaxicated when arrested, but his appearance did not indicate that he had been drinking for any length of time.
