There is a great deal more shooting done than appears on the surface. A givcerine wagon is seldom seen on the streets or roads in daylight. Scarcely a hight goes by, however, that they are not out in force, and the shooters busy placing the powerful compound in the dead or dying wells. The truth is that producers are ashamed or afraid to let their neighbors know of the subtle methods they are taking to get the oil. Just why it is so is hard to determine, but it is a fact, nevertheless. Midnight shoot-ing is more common now than it was in the exciting days of 'moonlighting.' When a man is compelled to put in a shot to revive an old well he seems load to dainit it to his neighbors, but the great amount of such work is done in wells which have been practically dead from the start. The sands, both the Gordon and fifth, have been proven to be very much like the circus leop-ard, and when a good well is brought in close to a well which has been small from the start, the owner of the latter almost always puts in a heavy shot in the hope of breaking up the sur-rounding rock sufficiently to open his well into the pool from which the adjoining well is drawing its oil.
