# A LIVELY STRUGGLE FOR POSSESSION

The Covenanter Church troubles are now fairly in court, and a most important point will be judicially decided. Attorneys Sol Schover and J. P. Hunter yesterday filed the paswer of the East End Reformed Presbyterian Church to the suit brought by John K. Denheim to forcelose the mortgage on the elurch property. The mortgage is dated June 27, 1891, and is for \$2,093. It was payble in 30 days from date, and contained a house of torfeiture if not paid in ten days. The ease is really a fight to obtain possession of the church property between the supporters of the Hev. O. B. Milligan, ormerly nastor of the congregation, who was denosed by Synod for his part at the famous "East End meeting," and who is now in the U. P. Church, and the faction of the congregation who remained as the East End Reformed Presbyterian Church.

The answer to the forcelosure proceedings is made by John C. Calderwood for the conpregation. He recites the trial and suspenion of the Rev. O. B. Milligan, paster of the church, and the withdrawal of Milligan and his followers, including James M. Denhalm and William J. Barnett from the Reformed Presbyterian Church, and their connection with the U. P. Church. They ceased, it is alleged, to be members of the Reformed Presbyterian Church in June,
