The decrease in crucity both te people and to beasts was commented on and the efforts of the society to spread a wider sense of kindness throughout the ani-mal kingdom and in the treatment of children were given in a manner to reflect the zeal of this work as exhibited in Allewhich it is held. The report of the treas-urer showed a balance of \$801 28. The reurer showed a balance of 8801 28. The re-ceipts during the year were \$4,269 05. The Secretary in his statement showed that 189 informations had been made and 130 of these secured conviction; 42 were not proven. Seven hundred and eleven cases were remedied. The cases attended to in-volved 1,505 animals, 79 of which were dis-patched to relieve suffering; 137 were cases of invite to animals. There were 106 cases of torsure to animals. There were 106 cases of crealty to aged persons; all of these received conviction. Five hundred and twelve cruelty to children cases were at-tended to, 53 of which suffered conviction,


