Mrs. Marzette Molan entered suit yesterday against Dr. W. S. Yates, the dentist. Mrs. Molan is the widow of Bernard Molan who died in Dr. Yates' chair in his office, No. 802 Penn avenue, December 26, while under the influence of vitalized air.
