When his labors are ended for the day he carries his piece of brass to the office and is cred-Ited with one day's pay. Heretofore, ac-cording to the officials, there has been a sort of a go-as-you-please schedule in force. If a man was a couple of hours late it was all right, and when a certain amount of work was done he could go home. This was ended with the check system, and now when the man completes his task he has to lay around the mill until it is time to

The employes of the open hearth steel department were the first to rebel against the new system and are now on a strike. If their demands are not satisfied the whole mill will come out. Yesterday a committee from that department waited on Manager Miller and held a long conference with him, but could not come to terms. The men will hold a meeting Saturday night, or possibly sooner. In the meantime the hearth department will remain idle from what could be learned vesterday.
