

COMING IN RAPIDLY.

Appeals by the Score from Fourteenth Ward Residents.

OBJECT TO ASSESSORS' FIGURES.

Several Demands are Made for Classification as Rural.

CUTS WANTED ALL OVER THE DISTRICT

Sixty-two property owners of the Fourteenth ward yesterday entered appeals against assessments. In a few exceptions the only objection was being changed from rural to full classification.

The appeals indicate that in the Fourteenth ward probably as much as in any other in the city a fight will be made on the classification question.
