The Executive Committee would respectfully ask that all the people who believe in Cleveland for President and who support these demands shall meet on the 14th of March next in their respective towns and villages, hold public meetings, rally their demands and take steps to elect delegates to a National Convention.

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How to set the Machinery in Motion. First.—In the meetings of Saturday, March 12, to ratify the work of the conference, local organizations, appoint a committee of three (unless one already exists), which should meet at the county seat as early as possible and not later than April 15.

LAKELWOOD, N. J., March 9, 1892. Hon. Edward S. Brazz: My Dear Sir—Your letter of the 5th instant is received. I have often thought until now that I might continue silent on the subject which, under the high sanction of your position as my fellow Democrat and fellow citizen, and in your earnestness for a true and trusted friend, you present to me.

Second.—When delegates are selected to the National Convention their names should be immediately addressed to the Secretary of the National Convention, so that he will be able to prepare a roll of States before the convention meets.

I have also an idea that the Presidency is pre-eminently the people's office, and I have been sincere in my constant advocacy of the effective participation in political affairs on the part of all our citizens. Consequently, I believe the people should be heard in the choice of their party candidates, and that they themselves should make nominations as directly as possible.

Third.—We also urge that the Executive Committee of each State meet at a convenient and fixed time, place and basis of representation for holding a State Convention or a meeting of delegates from their State to the National Convention shall be chosen.

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They are right in supposing that the subject is related to a duty I owe to the country and to my party, a condition exists which makes this a matter of public concern, and one which I cannot and will not abstain from.

Fifth.—We caution the people to take great care in selecting delegates to the Congressional, State and National Conventions. Select one who will be true to our cause, take men who have been tried and not found wanting.

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Sixth.—We again urge upon you the necessity of holding a State Convention to elect delegates to the National Convention, and to do this with the greatest secrecy and care.

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COMBINE OF CAPITAL. Great Britain and Chicago Wealth Strike Hands for Profit. THE DETAILS OF A NEW SYSTEM. Eminent English Financiers Interested in Money-Making Here. STARTING OUT WITH JUST \$50,000.000.

CHICAGO, March 14.—The Transatlantic Mortgage and Securities Trust, Limited, is the name of another colossal financial syndicate, the organization of which has just been perfected here by the signing of papers to which the names of some of England's greatest financiers had previously been attached.

Among the American founders are Directors Calvin Goodard, President of the Chicago and Southside Rapid Transit Company, better known as the Alley L Road; W. A. Newell, general manager of the Home Life Insurance Company of Chicago, and George Taylor, former of the wholesale firm of Gray, Kingman & Collins; H. C. Spear, the banker, and Frank S. Wright, of the law firm of Wright, Bulkley & Gray.
