Arguments in Favor of the Offer Made to Allegheny Councils.

The attention of Mr. John W. Beatty, who returned from New York yesterday, was called to the recent discussion of the project looking to the founding of a permanent collection of paintings in the Alletheny Carnegie Library, and his offer to secure, as gifts to the collection, ten pict-FOR ures, aggregating in value \$10,000. He said that this offer to Allegheny Councils was made because he thought it the most practical way to solve the difficulty of opening the gallery, and would insure the establishment of the collection upon a good stand-ard of art. A united effort of this kind would insure at least 20 good canvascs to begin with, and others of like quality would

naturally be attracted to the collection. Less than 20 pictures, Mr. Beatty thinks, would not be sufficient, and he is confident that Councils will act favorably upon the suggestion when the matter comes properly before that body, as the amount is really a very modest sum to be invested for a purpose of this kind, and without the sid of Councils it will be very difficult to secure a sufficient number of good works.
