Lively Contest Anticipated in the Pittsburg Presbytery

OVER THE ELECTION OF DELEGATES

To the Meeting of the General Assembly in Oregon Next Month.

TRYING TO BREAK THE REDSTONE SLATE

The Pittsburg Presbytery will meet at Wilkinsburg to-day, and while the session will dispose of considerable routine business, the dignified ministers will indulge in at is expected to be a decidedly lively contest for delegates to the General As sembly, which meets in Oregon early in

The Presbytery to-day will elect three ministers and three elders to represent the Pittsburg Presbytery, and with less than a half dozen exceptions every minister and elder in the organization has announced himself as a candidate for the proposed trip across the continent. All the legitimate expenses of the delegates will be paid by a tax laid upon all the churches of the nation, and the people of Portland, Ore., have already raised \$40,000 to defray the expenses of the visiting churchmen.

A Very Desirable Trip.

The contemplated trip, therefore, is a most desirable one, and the contest for delegates has been for several weeks carried on with the skill of well trained politicians. Letters the skill of well trained politicians. Letters have been written and legitimate wires have been pulled by the ambitious candidates, and when they get together to-day is is expected that the campaign will be closed much after the fashion of a political convention. The rivalry among the candidates is said to be entirely friendly, but a combination is hinted at that threatens to carry the

tion is hinted at that threatens to carry the day.

The contest for delegates to the General Assembly from the Allegheny Presbytery is said to be much the same as that among the Pittsburg brethren. The Allegheny Presbytery, however, when it meets at Beaver on the 12th, will have the Rev. Baussman case to dispose of, which will likely attract more general attention than the election of delegates. Rev. Baussman, who will be tried by the meeting for heresy, it was announced yesterday will make a vigorous fight for his position and his belief. He is admitted to be one of the brightest members of the Presbytery. He was educated for the law, and it is asserted by his school fellows that before he entered the ministry he was decidedly uncertain on religion, and when he decided to become a minister he surprised all his acquaintances. In a letter to a Pittsburg friend yesterday the Rochester minister announced that he would not be turned down without a contest.

An amusing feature of the contest for delegates to the General Assembly developed recently at the meeting of the Redstone Presbytery, composed of Fayette, Westmoreland and part of Allegheny county. The people of those counties are politicians, pure and simple, and not infrequently they carry their politics into their churches. The contest for General Assembly delegates was just as lively in that Presbytery as in the other organization, and a special meeting was called some weeks ago to dispose of some church matters. Before the meeting adjourned the election of delegates was sprung upon the gathering delegates was sprung upon the gathering and the little slate prepared by the minister-ial bosses was carried through without a flaw. Considerable discontent manifested itself ini bosses was carried through without a flaw. Considerable discontent manifested itself after the meeting, but no formal protest was entered. Last week, however, it was discovered that the rules required that delegates to the General Assembly shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Presbytery and at a specified time before the meeting of the General Assembly. This rule nullifies the election of the delegates from that Presbytery and another set of delegates must be elected at the regular spring meeting of the organization. Aircady a lively campaign is in progress in that Presbytery, and it is said an effort is being made to defeat those delegates chosen at the snap convention.
