"How did you come to marry ber?" asked Examiner Hoffmann. "I don't just exactly know that, but I was taught a lesson that will hereafter keep me from drinking. She had money and seemed badly gone on me, and I was enjoying it. She gave me money freely, and I spent it as

she gave me money freely, and I spent it as rapidly as she gave it. One day she filled me up with liquor, and next day when I got sobered up she showed me our marriage certificate. It nearly took my breath away, and I concluded it was time to get sober. I did, and we went to housekeeping on Fiftyfourth street.
"After that I noticed that she did not seem herself at times and acted as if she was much worried about something, and I

was of the opinion that she probably had left a family in the old country. I never asked her this, however. About a week ago her brother, who came over with her, died. Since then her condition has gradually be-come worse, until now she is violent." Papers were made out to have her committed to Dixmont, and she will be taken there as soon as possible.
