THE OHIO AND INDIANA OPERATIONS.

The monthly oil report for April is very bullish. There were 188 wells completed in April, against 149 in March, but the new production fell from 8,661 to 6,861 barrels.

There was an increase of 17 in the number of completed wells, and 33 of the 168 were dry, while last month there were 34 dusters in 149 wells drilled.

The operators in Butler and Armstrong counties found eight, Venango and Clarion had three and three were found in the Middle field. Only seven wells were put down in the Bradford and Allegheny, N. Y., fields, and they were all producers.

The bulk of the new production was produced in the southwest field. In that district there were 107 wells finished up, and these produced 5,747 barrels. This makes an increase of 166 barrels over the production of the southwest field in March.

At the end of March there were 78 new rigs up in the southwest field. In that district there were 70 finished, showing that the work for the month of April will probably be advanced over that of March.

In Allegheny and Bradford there are only four wells drilling and five rigs up. The Middle field can claim only eight drilling wells and four rigs, while Venango and Clarion have eight drilling wells and seven rigs up.

Butler and Armstrong have 43 wells drilling and only 13 new rigs, while at the end of last month they had 60 drilling wells and 17 new rigs. There are 10 rigs drilling in the Southwest and 20 new rigs completed.
