There have been no sales at the East Liberty yards this week and 75 and 80 carloads of cattle and 1,000 head of hogs.

Some ten loads of this week's offerings were held over from last week. The quality of offerings was below last week.

Markets opened on Monday morning with a wide divergence of view between buyer and seller. The former insisted on an advance, because of the diminished receipts.

Buyers came in more freely in the afternoon of Monday, and prices advanced 10 to 15c per cwt on desirable grades.

On Tuesday morning this advance was well maintained, and the final outcome of the week's trade showed up better to the seller than last week.

Fresh cows were in liberal supply, but general quality was low. Choice stock was in good request.

Since Monday receipts have been light, and prices have advanced 10 to 20c per cwt.

There were sales this morning at a nickel a pound and not enough to get around.
