The Clouds Fall to Break Away.

The clouds hovering over the iron market show no signs yet of breaking away. Reports from all the leading trade centers indicate a continuance of the depression in pig iron, with prices ruling in buyers' favor.

Stocks in warrant orders have undergone a further decrease, the last reports showing a total of 467,000 tons Scotch and 98,000 tons Cleveland, following a week of heavy withdrawals.
