

TURNED OUT TO DIE. Charge Made Against Hotel Keepers by the Widow of McHugh. STOCKHOLDERS DROP A SUIT. Victims of an Elevator Accident Ask for Heavy Damages.

THE NEWS OF THE LOCAL COURTS. The suit of Mrs. Mary McHugh against John B. Schlosser and G. C. Dellenebach, proprietors of the Hotel Schlosser, is on trial before Judge McHugh.

McHugh's husband, which was charged to the defendants. In February, 1921, it is alleged, McHugh was a resident of Oil City, was a guest at the hotel. He became ill and his money exhausted, and it is alleged, the proprietors of the hotel directed a porter to eject him.

He was thrown out of the hotel, and a short time afterward was found by the police lying in an alley in the rear. He was in a pool of water, and the patrol wagon was called and he was sent to Central station, where he died in a few hours. His death, it is alleged, was due to the exposure he met with in having been put out in the cold and wet in his weakened condition.

LET THE SUIT DROP. The action brought by dissatisfied stockholders comes to an end. The equity suit of H. Sellers McKee and others against the Monongahela Water Company, and its officers and directors, was concluded yesterday.

The plaintiffs were stockholders in the Monongahela Water Company. They alleged that the directors of the company, acting as individuals, purchased from George T. Oliver the franchise of a rival water company, for which he had obtained a license from the state.

Heavy Damages Asked by Sufferers. An echo of the elevator accident in the macaroni establishment of Bonastall & Esq., at 148 Penn. street, occurred December 31, 1920, drifted into the civil courts yesterday. In the accident Iraco Arizo was injured so that he died on June 27, 1921, and Antonio Fontana, 19 years of age, was so badly hurt that he has never yet fully recovered.

James Hennessy, a machinist of the Southside, entered a suit for \$5,000 damages against Mrs. Margaret V. Verner. Her husband's claims that prior to January 22, 1921, he was a strong, vigorous man, but on that date the defendant sent him before Alderman Meyer for the laundry of his wife. He was committed to jail for trial and on March 12 he was tried and acquitted. He claims there was no occasion for his arrest and that the confinement has seriously impaired his health.
