WYMAN IS FREE AGAIN

The Ex-Mayor of Allegheny Walks Out of Jail This Morning.

EATING BREAKFAST AT HIS HOME.

None the Worse for His Confinement Behind

the Iron Bars. HIS FRIENDS STILL STAND BY HIM

Ex-Mayor Wyman, of Allegheny, will walk out of the county jail at 6:30 this morning a free man, unless his Nemesis in the person of the Allegheny Reform Committee cause his re-arrest on some of the indictments they have against him, and upon which he was not tried. There will be no flourish over his departure from the jail. He will be released at the same time with half a dozen other prisoners. His buggy will be waiting for him and he will b quietly driven home to breakfast with his family for the first time since his three-

meaths' sentence went into effect. Physically, the ex-Mayor will leave the fall a better man than when he entered, politically, it is claimed by his friends, he will be just as strong as before his conviction. Whether his morals or social standing will have suffered or improved will require some time for the world to determine. He has not been sick an hour since his confinement in the prison.

He Looks and Feels Well,

His conduct has been such as to gain him the liberty allowed all willing prisoners, and he has necepted every opportunity for exercise, running up and down the long flights of stairs in course of his duties as rangeman, and in other ways keeping his ood in circulation and his muscular system in good condition. He is looking the picture of health and strength and much etter than when he entered the jail. There have been few days during his im-

orisonment that he has not been visited by In one day during the past week Allegheny City Conneilmen were seen to enter the jail, and no one doubted the object of their visit. It is safe to say hat a majority of the city Councilmen have visited the imprisoned more than once since tence was passed upon him. And there have been many others besides Councilmen, of whom no doubt called out of pure endship, but the bulk of them have had usiness of a political matter to talk on. A Visit From Mayor Gourley.

Among the visitors yesterday was Mayor Gourley. His call was purely a friendly one. He and Wyman have been firm friends for years and the Mayor, in spite of all the charges against Wyman, still be-lieves he was as much sinned against as sin-

He told a friend the other day that he intended to settle down to work in his established business as, he could make a good income at that without worry con-I know the energetic, hustling disposition of the man will care to believe this, however, and there are many predictions that, in a quiet, inoffensive way, the ex-Mayor will exert his power in Allegheny politics to square accounts with some of his former

The charge upon which the ex-Mayor was convicted on February 10 was illegally ex-torting \$111 50 in fines and costs from a rty of Hungarians who had been arrested or disorderly conduct. A new trial was asked for, and on March I the motion was rgued, but Judge Kennedy overruled it. o the surprise of all, he was ordered to pay the costs of prosecution and spend three months in jail. The costs were paid yestorsing and the sentence expires with the opening of the jail this morning.
