Bromine is Now Exported From This City to European Ports.

COFFEE CROP LARGEST FOR YEARS

Office of the Dispatch, PITTSBURGH, SATURDAY, June 11. There are four firms in Pittsburg and Allegheny engaged in the manufacture of salt.

Bromine, which is a residuum of salt, has been of late years a draw in the market and prices have been steadily drifting downward.

The coffee crop this season is reported to be the largest for the past six years. A surplus of one and a half million bags is expected.

The reduction agreed on by Allegheny tanners went into effect June 4, and trade is reported very quiet.
