

LIVE STOCK REVIEW.

Runs of Cattle at Local Yards Lighter Than Last Week. PRICE OF GOOD BEEVES ADVANCED.

Net Enough Light Firm Butcher Cattle to Go Around. SWINE HIGHER AND SHEEP STEADY

OFFICE OF THE DISPATCH, PITTSBURG, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15.

There has been on sale this week at the East Liberty yards about 50 loads of cattle, against 65 loads last week. Five loads of this week's offerings were held over from last week.

The principal source of supply was Chicago. The bulk of the cattle here were offered in our local markets of late came from Chicago.

With the exception of one load of Allegheny county cattle, there were no heavy primers on the market. This one load, which averaged 1,500 pounds, was held at \$4 75 per cwt.

Light tidy butcher beefs, weighing from 1,100 to 1,200 pounds, were scarce, and sold at an advance of 15c per cwt on prices of a week ago. The highest price paid this week was \$4 70.

Fresh cows were not in as large supply this week as last, and the quality of those on sale was low. Very few of the cows were reported above \$36 per head.

Veal calves were in fair supply and a shade higher, with \$5 50 as the top. There were not above 35 carloads of hogs on sale this week at East Liberty as against 55 loads last week.

As a result of the reduced receipts, markets here for all grades of hogs were at an advance of 25c per cwt. A few top hogs were sold as high as \$23, with a week's advance of 25c per cwt.

Good sheep were scarce and fair at last week's prices but common and inferior grades were dull and slow. Top prices of sheep was \$5 40 yearlings, \$6 00, and spring lambs \$5 50.

A Live Stock Firm's Review. Following is report of the week's transactions by William H. Hays, of the firm of Hays & Co., 60 South Second street.

Receipts of 60 loads of cattle on Monday, against 60 loads on Monday last week. Thirty loads were from Chicago and the balance from Ohio, Indiana and Pennsylvania.

There were two loads of spotted steers and two loads of spot bulls from Pennsylvania, which sold about same as grain fed of same weights.

The trade opened with a better feeling than on Monday last, but the market was not so lively as last week's prices. Buyers are now beginning to appreciate good grain-fed stock, and the market is showing a much wider spread of prices.

REALTY MOVING UP.

The Latest Transactions Show That Values Are Stiffening. ALIQUIPPA FORGING AHEAD.

Three Hundred Lots Sold Within Sixty Days and Fifty Homes Started. PROFITABLE ENTERPRISE CATCHING

Recent sales of central and suburban properties emphasize the statement frequently made that values are steadily enhancing. W. A. Herron & Sons yesterday disposed of a lot 20x100, and an ordinary building, on Market street, near First avenue, for \$3,500, or at the rate of \$470 a foot.

This is the best price ever obtained for property of this class in the square between First avenue and Water street. The sale in Wilkinsburg, reported yesterday, at \$260 a lot, illustrates the upward tendency in the rural districts.
