Weakness in Sogar and Lackawanna. Naw Yong, July 30.—Trading in the stock market was light to-day, but after a moder-ately firm opening, prices yielded slightly and the final changes, except in one or two stocks, were for the usual insignificant frac-tions. Brokers reported some increase in the outside demand and London had some buying orders in the market, which, how-ever, amounted to only 5400 shores or large Eggs and Polity. Eggs ruled easier at all points, and prices in this market declined fractionally; demand was only moderate. Chickens were in good supply and demand, and prices were firmly maintained. A few lots of dressed chickens, packed in ice, were on the market, but quotations were not given owing to the ab-sence of demand. Closing prices:
