Superintendent O'Mara Says Political Pulls Will Not Save Them.

POLICE PRACTICALLY DEFIED.

Father Sheedy Will Make a Stout Fight Against These Places.

THE COUNTY DETECTIVE AT WORK

"Speak-easies must go," said Superintendent of Police O'Mara yesterday, "and they must go quickly. We have been evaded long enough on this question, notwithstanding the repeated efforts of the department to seeme evidence against them. Dinging in our ears day after day was the ery of 'pull.' We were 'practically defied in carrying out the law. Things have changed, however, just now. We sprung something new on them, and intend to surprise a goodly number of these unlicensed

liquor sellers. "I have had to work under considerable disadvantages for some time past," continued Mr. O'Mara. "There were a number of eases which I attempted to push, but found it would be useless in the face of the evidence. The only thing left me to do was to institute a new course to catch the proprietors of these places. I am sanguine of great results.

"About that Sherry case," said the Superintendent, "some people might have in idea, and in fact some people have the den, that it was a case of persecution more than anything else. I am not here to persecute people, but to prosecute them when they do wrong. No officer of the law bounded Mrs. Sherry. She drew all the trouble on herself. She defied us time and again to touch her, and kept her place open night and day, as well as Sunday. The possibility is, however, that she has an idea about this time that she cannot do as she pleases with the Brooks

Father Sheedy Preparing for Work. Father Sheedy, the paster of Our Lady of Merey's Catholic Church, at Third and Ferry street, is one of the silent champions of the crusade just begun. Then he will renew the war against speak-easies and disrepu rable houses, and keep it up until the work is finished. Regarding a fund alleged to have been raised to push the work along, Father Sheedy said no such thing was in existence. He could not see any necessity for such a fund at present. He didn't have any hesitancy in assuming that Superintendent O'Mara would give him all the assistance he needed in a legitimate way and he would not ask for any that

At Mrs. Sherry's late home, where so much wine and beer was consumed, everything was dead yesterday. A sister of Mrs. Sherry said her sister had been very unfairly treated. She got a year in the work-house, where others convicted on a similar charge got only three months. "There has been considerable discrimination," she continued. "The prosecution emanated, I think, from the visit of a health inspector, who saw a good deal more going on in other houses in the locality than he did in this place. It is too bad to think that Mrs. Sherry will have to spend a year in such a place as the workhouse."
