## EXAMINING THE ROAD.

Pennsylvania Officers Will Visit Mc-Keesport This Morning

TO SEE ABOUT THE EXTENSION.

Captain Green Denies Reports About Mr. Roberts' Visit to Europe.

NO PROSPECTS FOR A NEW DEPOT HERE

The officers and directors of the Pennsylvania road reached here last evening on their annual inspection of the lines, and registered at the Monongahela House. President George B. Roberts is looking well since his return from Europe. Among the callers at the hotel were Superintendent Pitcairn, First Vice President James Mc-Cres and General Manager Joseph Wood, of the Pennsylvania Company, Superintendent McCargo, of the Allegheny Valley, and Superintendent Watt, of the Pittsburg, Virginia and Charlestown.

In the railroad party are President Roberts, Vice Presidents J. M. DuBurray and Captain J. P. Green, Directors A. M. Fox, N. P. Shortridge, H. D. Welsh, H. H. Houston, W. H. Barnes, A. R. Little and George Wood, General Manager Charles E. Pugh, Chief Engineer W. H. Brown and

Much stress is laid by the public on Mr. Roberts' visit to Europe this summer. It is claimed he saw a number of the leading shareholders on the other side, and furished them with valuable information. The plans of the company in connection with the World's Fair and other improvements contemplated were unfolded and received the hearty approval of the foreigners. It is added that special significance is attached to this inspection of the road, as it would give stockholders in this country a chance o confer with the officials about proposed mprovements.

Nothing Significant. These reports look well enough on paper, out Captain J. P. Green, Third Vice Presdent and spokesman for the party, tnocked them promptly into a cocked hat, He replied that the inspection is the mount affair, and there is nothing signifiant about it. Mr. Roberts, he said, went o Europe solely for pleasure, and he loubts if he looked at a railroad on the other side. He denied that he conferred with prominent English stockholders or my others. It was wondered, if so much cas to be done for other cities, where Pittsburg came in. Nothing was learned about he new depot for this city and when it would be commenced. It is the same old tory, the company is not ready to do the

This morning the party will go to Meteesport, where the greater part of the day vill be spent in looking over the ground. autain Green declined to disclose the comany's plan, but it is well known that the ennsylvania road will be extended to the briving city up the Monongahela river. A Bridge to Be Built.

The chances are a bridge will be built cross the river from the P., V. & C. side. he plan is under discussion, and a con-lusion will be reached after the inspec-

Early to-morrow morning the party will eave for Richmond, Cincinnati, St. Louis, bicago and Cleveland. The Allegheny falley road will be examined last. It as been decided to double-track his road to Oil City. It won't be done at nce, but numerous side tracks will be conceted and others will be built until the second track is completed. It is only a uestion of time also until the Pennsylvain secures control of the Western New ork and Pennsylvania from Oil City to tuffalo. This would give the company its wn line to the latter place from Pittsburg.
