It is reported that the meeting arranged to take place between Emperor William and the Duke of Cumberland at Schon brann to discuss the question of the Bruns-wick succession fell through owing to the ex-Queen of Hanover persuading the Duke of Cumberland not to go. During his stay at Schonbrunn, Emperor William oc ed the bedroom in which Napoleon the Great slept during the siege of Vienna.

The Austrian military riders who took part in the long-distance race have returned to Vienna, leaving about half their horses dead or disabled in Berlin. The German et the general public over the race has quite vanished and has been replaced by a sort of moral disgust. The German Society for the Protection of Animals has decided to protest against the brutality of the ride and to bring the question before the Reich-\$122.




