APPLICANTS HAVE BEEN PLENTY.

But the List Will Be Cut Down by the Election of Tuesday

MAKING TERMS OF OFFICE SO SHORT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—There are a number of vacancies in the higher offices of the executive departments of the Government, and the problem of filling them has been considerably complicated by the result of the recent election.

It is expected, of course, that when the administration changes, March 4, next, another general change will be made.

Whitfield's Successor to Be Named. In the Postoffice Department there is only one vacancy in the higher offices, and that is the office of the First Assistant Postmaster General.

Some Fine Missions to Go Begging. In the War and Navy Departments there are no vacancies in any of the important offices.

The most pitiful case was Miss Lizzie Butler, of this city, who got her head out of a window and pleaded with those about to save her, but her body was pinned by the freight car and it was impossible to extricate her.
