

THEY WANT AN ARMORY.

National Guardsmen Object to Giving the Market House to the Schools.
The Pittsburg members of the National Guard are considerably worked up over the ordinance passed by Common Council on Monday leasing the Fifth Avenue market house to the Central Board of Education for high school purposes. The old market house has been used as an armory. The military men contend that the city should provide them with an armory.
At the meeting of Select Councils tomorrow an effort will be made to have the ordinance authorizing the sale of the property passed instead of the ordinance passed by Common Council.

pital. He was terribly crushed. His recovery is doubtful.
