EDISON IS A WINNER

In His Suits Against Other Companies ALL THE INCANDESCENT LAMPS.

Infringers Must Come to Terms With the Owners of the Patent, BUT THEY MUST HAVE PROPER PRICES.

(SPECIAL TELEGRAM TO THE DISPATCH.)

New York, Dec. 15.—There was handed down in the United States Circuit Court of Appeals today a decision in the suit of the Edison Electric Light Company and the Edison General Electric Company, appellants, against the Sawyer-Mann Electric Company, appellee, sustaining the injunction obtained by the plaintiffs restraining the defendant from making, using or selling the incandescent lamps of the patent granted to Thomas A. Edison January 27, 1880, and now owned by the plaintiff.

The decision says, however: "The injunction order appealed from should be modified so as to cover only lamps made in infringement of the second claim of the patent, the other claim, not having been infringed, according to the judgment of the Circuit Court of this court. It should also contain a provision reserving the right to the plaintiffs to move for a vacation, suspension or modification of the injunction upon proof of special instances of the defendant on the part of the complainants or either of them to supply the lamps of the patent upon terms reasonable in the circumstances of the particular case, to the owners of electric-lighting plants which have been or shall be constructed in violation of the injunction of the Circuit Court sustaining the validity of the patent."

Rights of competing manufacturers. As to competing manufacturers the court says that the patent was in dispute. If, in consequence, their investments in other electrical apparatus will be rendered unprofitable, it is the consequence. The users who have supplied themselves with electric lighting plants from the infringers which required for their operation lamps of the Edison type, which have been in use for some time, and who are not willing to accept their lamps from the complainants upon reasonable terms, have much stronger equities than the manufacturers and infringers who have been in the market.

These equities the court will not disregard, but that would be reasonable terms if an application were made to the court on behalf of these users a question which can only be determined in each case upon its particular circumstances. As to those users, however, who have acquired these lamps after the date of the patent, the court says that if they are deprived of the use of the lamps, and as a consequence the value of their plants may be greatly impaired, they must accept the results as a consequence of their own negligence.

How It Affects the West. A special from St. Louis says: The decision affecting parties making or using the Edison incandescent electric lamp, handed down today by the New York Court of Appeals, and restraining the Sawyer-Mann Electric Company from making, using or selling lamps of the Sawyer-Mann type, affects St. Louis materially. It is regarded as the forerunner of a series of suits and injunctions. The West and the South are being alerted, and the Sawyer-Mann patents, so that of all the incandescent lamps used a great many of them are brought under the ban. It has been noted at some time that if the injunction prayed for in New York was granted, proceedings would be immediately brought here against individual electric light companies in this city, which are compelled to change to the Edison. Of the St. Louis companies the Missouri use the Westinghouse, and the Municipal and the City of St. Louis use the Edison, and the virtually the Edison, as all of the electric companies are consolidated under the name of the General Electric Company, except the Westinghouse.

THEY ORNAMENT THE LIPS. Pieces of Bone Inset in the Under Labial to Increase Its Size.

Among the Babines, who dwell in the north of the Columbia river, says the Brooklyn Eagle, a large under lip is regarded as a type of beauty. A small incision is made in the lip during infancy and a fragment of bone inserted. This is replaced from time to time by larger fragments, each operation being attended with severe pain, and at length pieces of wood measuring not less than three inches in length, and one and a half inches in width are inserted, causing the lip to protrude to a frightful extent.

A similar custom exists among the Paraguan Indians and the laborer who has Botocudo are inserted in a slit made in the lower lip. A Botocudo has been noticed to take a knife and cut a piece of meat to the size of the mouth, which is then inserted. Among the Hydrals (Queen Charlotte Island) it is considered a mark of the lowest breeding to be without this labial ornament of the lower lip.

When a young woman and an old one quarrel the elderly dame will reproach the younger one with her youth, inexperience, and general ignorance, pointing to the protruding lip as evidence of her youth. The High people think they have the best of it on the evidence before the court. It is expected that the judicial consideration of the case will be finally decided, and that it will finally be transferred to a commissioner to sit to the bottom.

LEVY ON HIS FALSE TEETH. A St. Paul Man Who Oves His Dentist Most Delivers Them Up.

ST. PAUL, Dec. 15.—William J. Woolsey seems likely to lose his false teeth by legal process. He owes Charles A. Van Duze, the dentist, a balance of \$20 for a gold plate of teeth.
