MAJORITY FOR PRATT.—The official returns give the following vote, viz: Pratt, 35,035; Carroll, 34,495. Majority for Pratt, 540.

It will be seen that the total vote cast for the State is 69,530—being 5,237 more than was cast at the late Presidential election, and 16,365 more than at the preceding Governor's election. In 1840 the Federal Whig majority was 700—Democratic gain in four years 100!
