tion of this commonwealth. In the 61st section of the act first mentioned it is enacted, that "every general and special election shall be open between eight and ten in forenoon and shall continue without interruption or adjournment until seven o'clock in the

evening, when the polls shall be closed. It is further directed, that the meeting of the Judges at the Court House, in the borough of Towarda, to make out the general return, shall be on the third day after the election, which
